This Friday, all students will be attending the Chamber







Athletics Practice - With the athletics carnival coming up very soon the Cockatoos have been learning all about the fun and exciting techniques they can use across the activities.


We are glad to see majority of our class are feeling healthy and happy after the recent illnesses floating about, however we do ask that everyone remembers

MATHEMATICS

WRITING


